The Guitar Department offers individual instruction in classical, steel string and jazz guitar for students beginning at age 8 through adults. Older students may be interested in our "beginning" and "introductory" guitar classes. Very young students, ages 4-7, may be interested in our Suzuki-based *Guitar for Young Children: Pre-Twinkle* class, followed up with individual instruction. Group classes and ensembles in all guitar styles are available during the Fall and Spring semesters for children and adults of all levels of musical experience and ability. Students wishing to explore contemporary repertoire may be interested in auditioning for the Jazz Ensemble, open to guitarists. Individual Instruction

Individual instruction is available at our downtown Baltimore (Peabody), Annapolis, Towson campuses and Howard County locations for students of any experience level, from beginner through advanced, for both children and adults. Students enrolling in individual instruction are required to have a practice instrument available. A placement interview is required for all new students. Contact J. Students are assigned to teachers for individual instruction according to schedule, campus, playing level and teacher availability. Students enrolled in individual instruction will have opportunities to participate in recitals, repertoire and master classes, either one of our music certificate programs and free admission to most Institute concerts.
