STUDENT MEDICAL COVERAGE

In order to ensure that you are receiving the best care possible, here are important things to remember:

- 1) Appointments are available during the following days/hours only:
 - *Mon/Thurs*
8AM to 7:30PM
 - *Tues*
9AM to 4:30PM
 - *Wed/Fri*
8AM to 4:30PM
- 2) Call 410-338-3052 for an appointment – **we do not have walk-in services**. For all other inquiries, call 410-338-3421.
- 3) Always **identify yourself as a Peabody student** when you call.
- 4) When you present for care, please **bring your student identification and supplemental insurance card/documentation**. All students are required to carry adequate health insurance coverage. You may incur additional fees for diagnostic tests, medications, supplies, etc. Generally, these additional fees will be billed to your supplemental insurance.

SERVICES AT JHCP AT WYMAN PARK INCLUDE:

- Primary medical care, to include diagnostic and treatment of acute and chronic problems, by appointment
- Routine gynecological examinations, instructions on self-breast examinations, and contraception education and counseling
- Allergy injections (student must call prior to appointment for detailed instructions)
- Suture removal, dressing changes, ear lavage, compress application, and topical preparations as prescribed
- Vaccine administration (with cost of vaccines billed to insurance)

IMMUNIZATIONS

All new students should be up-to-date on these immunizations prior to the start of the term or semester:

- **MMR** - Immunity can be documented in three ways:
 - 1) 2 MMR's
 - 2) 2 Measles, 2 Mumps, and 1 Rubella
 - 3) Positive blood titers for Measles, Mumps, and Rubella
- **Meningococcal vaccine or waiver**
- **PPD** - Students who have ever lived outside the United States for a total

of 6 months or more will need a negative PPD or a negative chest x-ray within the past year.

These vaccines are not required, but are highly recommended:

- **Tetanus-diphtheria**
- **Poliomyelitis**
- **Hepatitis B, 3 series**
- **Varicella (Chickenpox)**

Vaccines (including flu) are available to students for a nominal fee.

EMERGENCY NEEDS

In the case of a medical emergency, you should call 911.

If you have an urgent, non-emergent need after hours, you may call our office for advice or treatment options.

Crisis counseling and mental health-related care are provided by The Johns Hopkins University Counseling Center and Student Development Center. During regular business hours you may schedule an appointment by calling 410-516-8278 or after hours help is available by calling the Campus Police to reach the counselor on call.
