Peabody Preparatory 2009 Summer Course Schedule

The Peabody Preparatory has a two-fold mission. It offers gifted children and adolescents the opportunity to realize their highest potential as leaders of the next generation of performing artists. It also offers an education in music and dance to all members of the community who desire it, regardless of age, professional intention or previous training. This dual mission is based upon the notion that every individual has the capacity for artistic expression at some appropriate level of understanding and skill. The Peabody Preparatory of the Peabody Institute in Baltimore, a division of Johns Hopkins University, has offered professional music and dance instruction for 150 years to students of all ages and levels of experience and ability. It is recognized internationally for its faculty excellence, quality instructional standards, innovative and challenging curriculum, model certificate programs, teacher training and community music outreach. Each year, the Peabody Preparatory enrolls over 2000 students through its Baltimore main campus and branch locations in Annapolis, Howard County, and Towson, MD. The Annapolis campus, which offers music instruction, has been located at Maryland Hall since 1982.

Summer Session at the Peabody Preparatory

The summer session at the Peabody Preparatory provides a unique environment for all students. Returning students are able to maintain the continuity of their musical/dance studies, while new students are able to receive an introduction to the discipline of their choice. At the same time each summer, the Preparatory offers specialized dance and music opportunities at select campuses. These single and multi-week sessions and camps offer intensive study within disciplines. The general summer session of the Peabody Preparatory runs from June 19 to August 1 with make-up days August 3-8, if needed. Registration begins March 30, 2009. All programs will run during the regular session dates unless otherwise specified.

Individual Instruction

Private lessons are available to children and adults of all experience levels – from beginners through the most advanced levels of study. Lessons are scheduled on an individual basis and are contingent upon teacher availability. Students enrolling in individual instruction are required to have a practice instrument available. Lessons are available in the following disciplines at the Annapolis campus: piano, guitar, voice and flute. A limited number of individual and group classes are offered for instruction at the Annapolis campus. Students who wish to study other instruments, take dance classes, or have individual instruction at a different time other than those available at Annapolis, please contact the Baltimore main campus of the Peabody Preparatory for further information at 410-659-8100, ext.1130. Tuition (Summer semester)

Individual lesson tuition includes regular repertoire classes, recital participation, written progress reports, jury exams, optional participation in the Certificate Program and/or competitions, and free admission to all Peabody concerts and performances as follows:

- 30-minute lesson – \$264
- 45-minute lesson – \$396
- 60-minute lesson – \$528

Placement, Registration and Payment

For the Summer Session 2009, new and continuing students may submit their completed registration form either online, by mail, fax or in person with full payment. New students registering for individual instruction must indicate their need to be placed on the registration form. Upon receipt of the student's registration form and payment, students new to private lessons at the Preparatory will be contacted by the Annapolis campus coordinator to schedule a placement interview. Placement interviews for new students will be held at the Baltimore main (downtown) campus. New students are placed on a first come, first served basis. Due to limited space, registration before June 1 is strongly recommended. Upon acceptance and placement, payment should be mailed directly to the Peabody Preparatory Registrar's Office, 21 East Mount Vernon Place, Baltimore, MD 21202. EARLY CHILDHOOD MUSIC

GUITAR

The Guitar Department offers private instruction for Summer 2009 in classical guitar for students at all levels of musical experience and ability from ages 9 to adults, and in Suzuki-based guitar for young children from ages 4-7.

PIANO

Traditional piano instruction is offered at the Annapolis campus for all ages and levels of musical experience and ability for Summer 2009. It is mandatory that students have a piano in their home on which to practice. While acoustical piano is preferred, a full-sized electronic keyboard is acceptable for the first year of instruction.

VOICE

The Voice Department offers private instruction as well as group classes for Summer 2009. In private lessons, students concentrate on vocal technique and learn repertoire (mostly classical) in English and other languages. Group classes provide a supportive environment where students can acquire skills to provide a smooth transition into private voice lessons as the voice matures (about age 13).
