Directions to the Annapolis Campus

Route 50 East/West to Rowe Blvd. Exit #24 towards downtown/Historic Annapolis. Turn right at Taylor Ave. At the end of Taylor, merge onto traffic circle. Turn right onto Spa Road (second right); then take a quick left onto Greenfield Street. Maryland Hall is the brick building straight ahead. **Parking is Free.**

Peabody Preparatory Annapolis Campus

The Annapolis campus is housed at the Maryland Hall for the Creative Arts. Formerly the Annapolis High School, this building is now a non-profit community arts center for the visual, performing and creative arts and home to many of Anne Arundel County's leading arts organizations. The Preparatory's facilities there include teaching studios and classrooms and shared use of an 850-seat auditorium. Course offerings range from early childhood and guitar group classes to individual instruction in flute, guitar, piano and voice for children and adults of all levels of musical experience and ability. Individual Instruction

Individual instruction is available at the Annapolis campus for students of any experience level, from beginner through advanced levels of study, for both children and adults. Students enrolling in individual instruction are required to have a practice instrument available. The Annapolis campus offers lessons in:

All students new to individual instruction at Peabody who wish to enroll for Fall/Spring 2011-2012 may view our catalog online for complete course listings at <http://www.peabody.jhu.edu/register>. Online registration is available on this webpage with full instructions to assist you through the registration process. For assistance with online registration, please call the Peabody campus (downtown) registrars at 410-234-4634/4635. A \$50 registration fee is required with registration. Upon receipt of online registration and fee, the student will be contacted to schedule a placement interview. New students are scheduled for placement interviews on a first-come, first-served basis. They are assigned to teachers according to schedule, campus, playing level and teacher availability. Due to limited space, registration

before August 20 is strongly recommended. It is the desire of the Preparatory to accommodate as closely as possible the scheduling needs of the student. On those rare occasions when a student cannot be placed, a full refund of the \$50 registration fee will be issued.

Flute, Harp & Piano

Individual instruction in flute, harp and traditional piano is offered at the Annapolis campus. It is mandatory that piano students have a piano in their home on which to practice. Electronic keyboards are not considered a good substitute for an acoustic piano. *Harp Ensemble* and *Four Hands: Sight-Reading for Pianists* group classes, as well as *Peabody's Young Pianists* program, Suzuki-based piano instruction, are offered at the Peabody (downtown) and Towson campuses during the fall/spring semesters.

Voice

The Voice Department offers individual instruction as well as group classes at the Annapolis campus. In individual instruction, students concentrate on vocal technique and learn repertoire (mostly Classical) in English and other languages. Group classes provide a supportive environment where students can acquire skills to provide a smooth transition into private voice lessons as the voice matures (about age 13). Adult voice students may be interested in *Basics of Singing 3* at the Peabody (downtown) campus.
